




SFLS Campus Map





Floor Plan 4th Floor, Building 1 & 2





Floor Plan 5th Floor, Building 1







1. ALCOHOL POLICY

Consumption and/or possession of alcohol will not be tolerated under any circumstances. If a delegate is found to possess, consume and/or to have possessed or consumed alcohol, the participant's school will be immediately expelled from the conference and hotel; criminal complaints may be pursued against the delegate in question.

2. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES POLICY

Controlled substances are likewise illegal and intolerable. The school of any participant found to unlawfully possess or use, or to have unlawfully possessed or used any controlled substance will be immediately expelled from the conference and hotel; criminal complaints may be pursued against the participant in question.

3. SMOKING POLICY

Cigarette smoking is NOT permitted in the Conference Venue.

4. CONFERENCE VENUE COURTESY

Participants will be held responsible for vandalism or any other damage of their fault that occurs. Rowdiness in the hallways, excessive noise, roughhousing, throwing objects, accessing prohibited areas of the hotel premises, and/or other unruly behavior will not be tolerated. False fire alarms will be dealt with severely. The conference venue reserves the right to eject delegates for these or other disruptions to the safety and well-being of other guests.

5. FACULTY ADVISOR RESPONSIBILITY

Faculty Advisors must cooperate with conference staff and hotel, and assist in achieving delegate compliance with conference rules and policies.

6. VALUABLES

If delegates must bring valuables, they are encouraged to place them in a hotel safe deposit box. MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025 and the Conference Venue are not responsible for belongings left in guest rooms or in meeting rooms.

7. DISPLAYS IN WINDOWS

The Conference Venue strictly prohibits the exhibition of any visible display in windows. Continued exhibition of any such display after an initial warning may be grounds for expulsion from the venue and/or conference.

8. EXPULSION FROM THE CONFERENCE

The Secretary-General reserves the right to expel any delegate, delegation, school, or group thereof from the conference at any time for violating or failing to comply with conference regulations, or for any other reason. MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025 has a zero-tolerance policy concerning alcohol and controlled substance, and violations of the alcohol and/or controlled substance policies will always be met with expulsion. Expulsions take effect immediately at the time they are issued. All conference registration materials (e.g. conference badges and placards) must be surrendered to conference staff upon expulsion. There are no refunds of conference fees for delegations asked to leave the conference.







9. DRESS CODE AND CONFERENCE BADGES

The safety of conference participants is of paramount importance to MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025. To maintain and enhance delegate security, the conference requires all conference participants to visibly wear conference badges at all times during the conference; all delegates are required to adhere to the conference dress code. Participants who fail to adhere to these rules may be excluded from conference proceedings and events. Conference staff reserves the right to check conference badges of any participant at any time, for any reason whatsoever.

10. PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO

Throughout the conference, conference staff and representatives of the conference may take photographs, videos, and interviews that show conference participants both during and in between committee sessions, and which may be used for promotional, educational, or other purposes by MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025. By attending the conference and signing the liability release form, participants consent to be photographed, videotaped and/or interviewed and authorize the conference to use those photographs, videos, and/or interviews, in any manner of MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025's choosing.

11. USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES DURING THE CONFERENCE

In regular committees, electronic devices are permitted only during document writing. In crisis committees (Vikings and Y2K), the use of electronic devices is prohibited throughout the conference, except under special circumstances with the chair's permission. The rules regarding the use of electronic devices in each committee may be dynamically adjusted by the respective committee chairs if needed.

12. PROHIBITION OF HARASSMENT AND DISCRIMINATION

Delegates should respect the positions and cultural differences of all delegations during the conference. Any form of harassment, discrimination, or discriminatory behavior—including language, actions, or attitudes such as insults, intimidation, demeaning remarks, or discrimination based on race, gender, religion, nationality, age, sexual orientation, or disability—is strictly prohibited.

13. ADHERENCE TO ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

In preparing for and participating in the conference, delegates are prohibited from plagiarizing or copying the intellectual property of others. All authoritative sources referenced within documents, including Position Papers and Draft Resolutions, must be cited appropriately.

14. PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF GENERATIVE AI FOR DOCUMENT PRODUCTION

The Organizing Committee strictly prohibits the use of generative artificial intelligence (e.g., ChatGPT, Gemini, Claude, Doubao, Deepseek, or similar tools) in creating any materials submitted to the Organizing Committee, the Dais or when address the entire committee, including, but not limited to, position papers, draft resolutions, and speeches. Any delegate found to have used generative AI for such purposes may face serious consequences, including potential disqualification from awards. Delegates are expected to submit and present original work that reflects their own research, analysis, and writing.

15. USE OF LANGUAGE

Delegates must communicate and interact throughout the conference using the working language(s) designated by the organizing committee and Dais (e.g., Chinese, English). This includes, but is not limited to, speeches on the General Speakers' List, statements during the Moderated Caucus,







discussions during the Unmoderated Caucus, and any related documents produced during the conference.

16. AWARD

MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025 values the learning experience of a Model United Nations conference above all else, MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025

prefers not to stress awards during conference, as we feel that participation and success should not be regarded in terms of who wins the most awards. With that being said, we do issue two types of awards at MUNUC-SFLS Model United Nations Conference 2025. The first type of award are the "Delegate Awards".

Outstanding Delegate

- The honor of Outstanding Delegate is the highest honor at the MUNUC. It is awarded to the most remarkable delegate in each committee and is the highest honor of all individual awards.
- If two delegates represent a country in the committee as a delegation, the honor of "Outstanding Delegate" will be awarded to both delegates simultaneously.

Honorable Mention

- The award of Honorable Mention is next to the honor of Outstanding Delegate.
- No more than 8% for the MUNUC sub-conference of committee member states can be presented with this honor.
- If two delegates represent a country in the committee as a delegation, the award of "Honorable Mention" will be presented to both delegates simultaneously.

Verbal Commendation

- The award of Verbal Commendation is next to the honor of Honorable Mention at the MUNUC sub-conference.
- No more than 15% of committee member states can be presented with this honor.
- If two delegates represent a country in the committee as a delegation, the award of "Verbal Commendation" will be presented to both delegates simultaneously.

Delegates will be judged by the Committee Directors, in conjunction with the Secretariat where necessary, against the following criteria:

- Knowledge of the topic(s);
- Understanding of current affairs and international relations;
- Quality of public speaking;
- Diplomacy and ability to compromise;
- Contribution to resolution writing; notate bene the Best Delegate does not necessarily have to pass a resolution.

The Committee Directors' decisions on awards are final and not subject to appeal. Should any delegate wish to question the awards, the faculty advisors must approach either the Secretary-General or the Director-General.

The second type of award are the "Delegation Awards". There will be three sets of Delegation Awards, and the awards will be given on the basis of overall performance and delegation size. MUNUC-SFLS







Model United Nations Conference 2025 Staff and Secretariat reserve the right of confidentiality in regards to its awards policy.

17. OTHER RULES

These rules are in addition to those laws and ordinances established by the People's Republic of China, participating schools' policies, and common sense. Serious infractions will result in dismissal from the conference of individuals and/or delegations/schools involved.

18. ADDITIONAL RULES AND POLICIES

The Secretariat reserves the right to issue additional rules or to alter existing rules at any time at their discretion.

19. INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The authoritative determinations of fact and interpretations of conference rules and policies are those of the Secretariat.

20. In the event of any violations of the aforementioned conference policy and academic norms,

delegates or faculty advisors may report the matter to the organizing committee staff or the Dais Chair. Except in cases where evidence of misconduct is clear, the complainant bears the burden of proof. Complainants must not fabricate, exaggerate, or rely on subjective assumptions. Upon verification of the specific circumstances, the organizing committee or Dais will hold the individuals accountable, with potential measures including, but not limited to:

- The offending party offering a personal apology to the affected individual(s).
- The offending party making a public apology.
- The organizing committee issuing an oral or written warning to the offending party.
- The organizing committee disqualifying the offending party (and/or their delegation) from award eligibility.
- The organizing committee revoking the offending party's eligibility to participate in the conference.

Additionally, given that all delegates are minors, any confirmed misconduct will be promptly reported to their Faculty Advisor (if applicable), their school or organization, and their guardians.







Accommodation Regulations

- 1. Accommodating students must strictly obey all the following Accommodation Regulations. The curfew of the dormitory and hotel is at 9:30 pm.
- 2. Valuables must not be brought into the dormitory. Delegates will take full responsibility for every missing item.
- 3. Delegates are not allowed to use electrical appliances in the dormitory.
- 4. Delegates will be held responsible for vandalism or any other damage of their fault that occurs. Rowdiness in the hallways, excessive noise, roughhousing, throwing objects, accessing prohibited areas of the hotel premises, or other unruly behavior will not be tolerated. False fire alarms will be dealt with severely. The committee reserves the right to eject delegates for these or other disruptions to the safety and well-being of other.
- 5. Accommodating students shouldn't enter others' dorm room (especially between different genders) and must stay in their rooms after 9:30 pm.
- 6. Committee members will check each student's existence in his/her dormitory every day at 10pm and will check around through night to ensure the dormitory is kept quiet. No members should walk out of the dorm room after the curfew for any reasons, including but not limited to, buying things, receiving water.
- 7. Dormitory will be available for students at noon, but no noises should be made either. There will also be committee members checking on the corridor at that time.







Meals

The School Cafeteria (located next to the student dormitory) is the place where you are going to enjoy our meal services during the conference. The 2nd and 3rd floors are open to the conference participants.

The School Cafeteria operates on a self-service basis, with each dish individually priced. After selecting your meal, please present your meal coupon at the payment counter. Breakfast coupon have a value of 15 RMB, while lunch and dinner coupons are valued at 25 RMB. **Any amount exceeding the coupon's value must be paid for by the delegate.** If the meal coupon is lost, delegates can pay directly at the payment counter.
